Skills	<p>History: To be able to use dates and vocabulary relating to the passing of time, including ancient, modern, BC, AD, century and decade, to learn about the social, cultural, religious and ethnic diversity of the societies studied, to identify and describe reasons for, and results of, historical events, situations, and changes in the periods studied, to describe and make links between the main events, situations and changes within and across the different periods and societies studied, to understand how to find out about the events, people and changes studied from an appropriate range of sources of information, including ICT-based sources, to study everyday lives of men, women and children, of past society.</p> <p>Geography: Pupils investigate a variety of people, places and environments on different scales in the United Kingdom and abroad, and start to make links between different places in the world. They find out how people affect the environment and how they are affected by it. They carry out geographical enquiry inside and outside the classroom, to use appropriate geographical vocabulary (for example, temperature, transport, industry), to use atlases and globes, and maps and plans in a range of scales (for example, using contents, keys, grids) to use secondary sources of information, including aerial photographs (for example, stories, information texts, the internet, satellite images, photographs, videos), to use ICT to help in geographical investigations (for example, creating a data file to analyse fieldwork data) to identify and describe what places are like, to compare their life to a child who lives in a country that is less economically developed.</p>
