The A-level History course is divided into three separate units. Components 1 and 2 will be taught simultaneously across 13, while unit 3 will be completed in the first half of year 13.

Unit 1 is a breadth study looking at Stuart Britain and the crisis of monarchy 1603-1702.

Unit 2 is a depth study looking at the Cold War 1945-91.

Unit 3 is a coursework module which focuses on the African-American Civil Rights Movement.

Discussion on individual liberty and national identity in the context of the Glorious Revolution and establishment of a Bill of Rights.
