Agreement / eSafety Rules

The following agreement is to be sent to students at the start of each academic year. Students are required to sign in agreement to adhering to our expectations.

- 1. I will not tell other people my ICT passwords.
- I will only open/delete my own files.
- 3. I will only open email attachments from people I know, or whom my teacher has approved.
- 4. I will make sure that all ICT contact with other children and adults is responsible, polite and sensible.
- 5. I will not deliberately look for, save or send anything that could be unpleasant or nasty. If I accidentally find anything like this I will tell my teacher immediately.
- 6. I will not give out my own details such as my name, phone number or home address. I will not arrange to meet someone I've met over the internet.
- 7. Images and video and audio recordings of pupils and/or staff will only be taken, stored and used for school purposes in line with school policy and not be distributed outside the school network without the permission of the School, for example by uploading it to YouTube or a social networking site.
- 8. I will be responsible for my behaviour when using ICT because I know that these rules are to keep me safe.
- I will support the school approach to online safety and not deliberately upload or add any images, video, sounds or text that could upset any member of the school community.
- 10. I know that my use of ICT can be checked and that my parents/guardian can be contacted if a member of school staff is concerned about my eSafety.
- 11. I understand that my email account will be disabled and deleted after I leave HCH and all content will be permanently deleted
